Overview

This forum has been organized by Florida International University in partnership with Hope Through Healing Hands to highlight the critical importance of U.S. global health leadership. Although global health programs make up less than half of one percent of the U.S. Federal budget, the U.S. has led the world in achieving remarkable health improvements over the last twenty-five years. A few examples include, the significantly decreasing of under-five child deaths globally from 12 million in 1990 to 6 million last year, and increasing the number of people living with HIV/AIDS in Africa who have access to treatment from 50,000 in 2003 to more than 9 million in 2014. Much more work remains to be done, and today's forum aims to broaden and deepen support within the Miami community for continued U.S. global health leadership and bold investments in life-saving health assistance programs.
